Chairman's Report



At our October Branch meeting, held at the Toby Carvery in Brockworth on Wednesday 1^{st} , I outlined the most recent National Association aspirations for the closure of the Association in 2027 following the Reunion and AGM in Blackpool in September. To summarise:

- The 2027 Reunion and AGM will be held in Blackpool in early September
- It is hoped that there will be a North and South final Service and buffet to formally close the National Association in November 2027. Dates and venues to be confirmed
- There will be no funding for Branch members who wish to attend their regional Service. It was considered that two years notice would provide Branches time to raise funds to provide transport to and from the two regional Services.

Our Branch held a Committee meeting prior to the National AGM. It was unanimously decided that the Gloucestershire Branch would hold their final Service to commemorate the 60th Anniversary of the Withdrawal from Aden on Monday the 29th November 2027 at the War Memorial in Cheltenham.

We have arranged a contingency plan if other Branches want to attend a Service and buffet lunch in Gloucester which will be held on Sunday 28th November 2027. The proposed venue can accommodate approximately 150 people in the Church and afterwards in the Church Hall. The event will take place in one location with parking and easy accessibility.


Following the closure of the National Association on the 29th November 2027 the Gloucestershire Branch will reopen as an independent Aden Veterans group functioning on a similar basis to our current structure.

All the details for both the National Association and Gloucestershire Branch closures will be discussed at future Branch meetings.




Editor's Report
